

Allocation guidelines for the »Bauhaus.Module« Promotion Fund Winter Semester 2021/22

In the tradition of the historical Weimar Bauhaus, the format »Bauhaus.Module« allows students at Bauhaus-Universität Weimar to expand their studies by explicitly interdisciplinary courses and thus to deal with a variety of new perspectives, to test the cooperation with other disciplines and to reflect on their own actions. This is achieved through an appropriate interdisciplinary acquisition of competence and knowledge and through inter- or transdisciplinary project work. In this way, »Bauhaus.Module« contributes to the reflection of one's own discipline, awakens a deeper interest in current social issues and promotes innovative solutions for one's own discipline as well as for other subject cultures.

The »Bauhaus.Module« promotion fund supports teachers as well as students with the implementation of their respective teaching offer and aims at making innovative teaching formats possible.

The courses of the »Bauhaus.Module« are categorized into three areas:

[a] locate

These include courses that invite students to examine questions of the present and future in the context of the historical Bauhaus, Weimar, Thuringia or Central Germany. They establish local or regional references, deal with the idea and history of the institution, the classification and reception of the Bauhaus in the history of ideas, the modes of working and impact and/or today's points of departure in shaping the world of tomorrow.

[b] insight

These include courses that offer focused introductions to the disciplines represented at Bauhaus-Universität Weimar. The course makes methods and/or methodologies or theories tangible and usable for students of different disciplines or teaches the basics of science communication or knowledge transfer.

[c] shaping

These include inter- or transdisciplinary teaching projects that are inspired by different disciplines (ideally: technology – science – art) and that contribute to addressing current social challenges and global future issues.

The three formats of the »Bauhaus.Module« include (1) joint courses by lecturers from different disciplines, (2) courses in collaboration with external partners and (3) the student-led teaching and learning projects.

The following overview illustrates the relationship between areas and formats of the »Bauhaus.Module«. Due to the different values (ECTS) of the teaching formats in the various courses of study at the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar, it is desirable that students will be able to complete courses with varying degrees of academic achievement and corresponding credit points.

Funding lines of the »Bauhaus.Module« Promotion Fund

The interdisciplinary »Bauhaus.Module« are funded in three funding lines, each of which allows for different formats:

Funding Line B1:

Internal Perspectives – Interdisciplinary courses by Bauhaus-Universität Weimar academic staff

Total Funding Amount: up to 15,000 €

Funding Amount per Application: up to 2,500 €

Eligible Candidates: Professors and academic staff employed at Bauhaus-Universität Weimar at the time of application and project implementation

Funding Line B2:

External Perspectives – Interdisciplinary courses in collaboration with guest lectures and experts

Total Funding Amount: up to 15,000 €

Funding Amount per Application: up to 2,500 €

Eligible Candidates: Professors and academic staff employed at Bauhaus-Universität Weimar at the time of application and project implementation

Funding Line B3: Interdisciplinary student-led teaching and learning projects

Total Funding Amount: up to 15,000 €

Funding Amount per Application: up to 3,500 €

Eligible Candidates: Students enrolled at the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar at the time of application and winter semester 2021/22

Funding Line B3: Interdisciplinary student-led teaching and learning projects

What is the aim of this funding line?

The funding line »interdisciplinary student-led teaching and learning projects« supports projects that enable in-depth, interdisciplinary study and teaching. All enrolled students of the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar are invited to develop their own formats and to test them with the help of this funding line. The student-led teaching and learning projects thus enrich the spectrum of the »Bauhaus.Module«.

Special emphasis is placed on interdisciplinary projects that enable new approaches and perspectives on questions of our time and allow them to think ahead. Teaching projects with an international or regional focus in German or English are especially welcomed. In addition to professional qualifications, the acquisition of inter-disciplinary skills is aimed to be strengthened.

Eligible: Students of the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar who are enrolled at the time of application as well as during the winter semester 2021/22 and have a mentor.

Who and what is being funded?

Support is provided for the preparation, implementation and follow-up of independent courses (teaching/learning projects) for which the students of the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar bear responsibility.

Funding may be requested for

- personnel costs for student employees to independently prepare and follow-up courses with a maximum number of hours of 60 hours for courses 2 SWS/ 3 ECTS, 120 hours for courses with 4 SWS/6 ECTS or 240 hours for courses with 8 SWS/12 ECTS and more (please calculate with 12.83 € per hour, billing is according to the currently valid hourly rates). In the case of an integrated additional teaching assignment or guest lectures, the number of hours is to be reduced.
- lectureship for external lecturers who teach a course together with a lecturer from the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar (in accordance with the Satzung zur Vergütung von Lehraufträgen);
- Supplementary guest lectures as a part of a joint course given by different teachers (in accordance with the [Satzung zur Vergütung von Lehraufträgen](#));
- printing and material cost up to a maximum of 250 € (e.g. for flyers or posters).

Excluded from funding are

- means of tendering for sub-competitions,
- material such as equipment or devices for IT,
- catering and
- excursions.

Prerequisites for the implementation of a student-led teaching project are

- the attendance of the didactical training before the start of the project
- participation in a teaching evaluation for the course.

The funding of a course is possible with a maximum of 3,500 € within the framework of the above-mentioned conditions. Possible incidental or follow-up costs cannot be supported by the »Bauhaus.Module« Promotion Fund. No teaching assignments can be given to members or employees of the Bauhaus-Universität.

Who can submit an application?

Students of all faculties at the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar are entitled to apply. An application can be made by individual students as well as by several students together. When making the application, it must be taken into account that the students to be supported are enrolled during the execution of the teaching/learning project. A course jointly held by several students can only be funded once. The funding of repeated performance of the same course is not possible. Each student teaching/learning project requires a mentor who will give a "Mentoring Commitment" upon application.

What are the criteria for funding?

The conditions for funding are:

- the course is designed to address students from different disciplines and
- the requirements for participation can be fulfilled by as many students as possible and
- the methodical-didactical design enables a successful participation and
- the course falls within one of the following thematic areas:

[a] locate

These include courses that invite students to examine questions of the present and future in the context of the historical Bauhaus, Weimar, Thuringia or Central Germany. They establish local or regional references, deal with the idea and history of the institution, the classification and reception of the Bauhaus in the history of ideas, the modes of working and impact and/or today's points of departure in shaping the world of tomorrow.

[c] shaping

How and where to apply?

Applications shall be submitted electronically. Please use the form »[Antrag Bauhaus.Module – B3](#)«. Application deadline for the winter semester 2021/22 is the July 4th, 2021.

What is the following procedure after the submission?

A selection committee makes the decision on the funding.

Applicants will be informed on the decision by E-Mail at the end of July 2021, and the funded projects will be announced on the »Bauhaus.Module« website. The courses entry into Bison is made by the teachers themselves.

Teachers whose projects are supported by the »Bauhaus.Module« fund must submit a short report no later than six weeks after the end of the lecture period. The report template is sent out with the approval.

A didactical training will be held for student teachers in September 2021. The attendance is a prerequisite for funding.
