

## **Announcements of the examination committee Computer Science and Media/Computer Science for Digital Media**

### **Introduction**

The examination regulations applicable to all students depend on the regulations in force at the time of registration, unless a request to change to previous examination and study regulations was made and authorised.

The following published decisions present amendments and additions to the interpretation and application of the examination and study regulations for the field of Computer Science and Media.

### **Decision from 20.11.2013**

On 20.11.2013, the examination committee took the decision to recognise examination results for the optional module in the Bachelor's programme and the elective module in the Master's programme in CSM/CS4DM. As of the beginning of the 2014 Summer Semester, the following courses, which are not taught by university teachers, will only be recognised with 50% of their respective credit points:

- computer-science-related courses taught by teachers who are not qualified to examine in Computer Science and Media/Computer Science for Digital Media
- courses which are mainly concerned with the introduction to the operation of a programme

### **Decision from 22.04.2015**

From the winter semester 2015/16 onwards, the degree programme in Computer Science and Media/Computer Science for Digital Media will recognise language courses only in **English** and **German as a Foreign Language**. A maximum of 6 ECTS (credit points) will be awarded for such courses.

With all other languages, the examination committee will decide on a case-by-case basis. This must involve a separate application by the student and a justification of recognition.

### **Decision of 17.06.2015**

The examination committee wishes it to be known that the prerequisites prescribed for the study programme in CS4DM must successfully be fulfilled with the given grade.

If the required grade is not achieved at the first attempt, the examination is to be repeated. In accordance with the examination regulations (§ 13 (2)), students are granted a maximum of three examination attempts.

### **Decision of 04.05.2016**

The examination committee wishes to stress that only the information given in the official course catalogue (Vorlesungsverzeichnis), regarding the allocation of courses to the different modules, is valid. Please note that this information is only valid for the current semester.

Any conflicting information which might be given on the website of the study programme, as part of the examination registration process on BISON or the allocation of grades on BISON's computerized database has no validity.

Any applications for the recognition of courses in other modules (other than those indicated in the course catalogue) will not be considered by the examination committee. This decision is to be implemented with immediate effect.

### **Decision of 19.04.2017**

In order to ensure the academic standards of non-departmental courses, they should be taught by a lecturer or contract teacher who is employed by the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar.

Should this not be clear from the course details given in BISON, then a brief communication from the lecturer or teacher to the examination committee (for example, by e-mail) will suffice. It is important that this communication, whose purpose is simply to clarify the lecturer's responsibility, should include the lecturer's name, the title of the course and the number of credit points (ECTS) available to students of Computer Science for Digital Media

### **Decision of 17.05.2017**

As of the Summer Semester 2017, it will no longer be necessary to submit grades for individual courses as indicated in the admission letter. A simple pass will suffice.
