### **Information for Erasmus and exchange students and for Academic Coordinators**

*The Faculty of Architecture and Urbanism welcomes Bachelor and Master students on Erasmus or other exchange programmes.*

*The general language of instruction at our faculty is German - with some exceptions:*

*The Master courses [European Urban Studies \(EU\)](#) and [Advanced Urbanism](#) (AdUrb, formerly IUUS) are taught in English (all lectures, seminars, design studios, classes etc.). The study regulations of these courses are available from the Website of the [Institute for European Urban Studies \(IfEU\)](#). They also include a chart, which explains the course/ module structure, including the number of credits assigned to each courses. Some seminars and lectures offered within these two Master programmes are also open to students who study in the Master of Architecture programme. Decisions are made by the individual lecturers, and may vary from semester to semester. Whether an individual seminar, studio or lecture is open to Erasmus and exchange students is depending on both, the number of students wishing to enrol for the specific course and decisions of the lectures running the courses.*

*There is another Master degree programme called MediaArchitecture taught bilingually in German and English. Additionally, there is the option to do two out of the four semesters of this Master course at the University at Buffalo, SUNY - as an interdisciplinary, integrated double degree Masters program entitled „International MediaArchitecture Master Studies“ (IMAMS).*

*Within the Master of Architecture programme there is also one well established studio package (design studio plus accompanying lectures, seminars etc) called iAAD which is fully taught in English. It is offered each summer semester (April to July). Students*

doing the whole package gain 30 credit points, the amount of credits Erasmus students are often expected to do. For details please consult [this Webpage](#).

Other than that, individual seminars, design studios or lectures are taught in English on a non-regular basis, e.g. if visiting scholars teach at our faculty for a semester or so, and prefer English as a language of instruction; or if local lecturers decide to offer a studio or class in English.

For Erasmus or other exchange students this means that they have to search for studios, seminars, lectures etc. offered in English. Usually they will manage to find a sufficient number of interesting courses in order to fulfil the requirements of their sending institution. Choices are wider though, if students speak (or at least, understand) German at an academic level.

A (not fully updated) English-German translation of the modules the Master of architecture course consists of you will find in this [Excel file](#). The file also translates the denominations of the professorships, which are part of the faculty, and relates professorships to modules.

### **Bachelor courses:**

Our Faculty offers two Bachelor courses, one in Architecture, and the other one in Urban Studies.

The language of instruction for both courses is German, though in the Bachelor of Architecture course some lectures do offer lectures or seminars in English on occasion. In a way we compensate for that by allowing exchange students who do not seek a degree at the Bauhaus-Universität to participate in courses (lectures, seminars, design studios etc.) offered for our Masters students. As indicated above, there are more courses available in English at that level. During the past years we could also observe that most exchange students who knew little German managed to gain their credits that way with no major difficulty.

The chart does not reflect the most recent state of our Bachelor of Architecture course structure though it is pretty close. One major difference is that undergraduate students (usually during their fifth semester) have to spend a semester at another university (usually abroad) or, as an alternative, do an internship (e.g. in an architect's office in Germany or abroad).
