When: 27 & 28 September 2023, 10:00 - 12:00

Workshop "Innovative Didactics & Intercultural Competence"

The workshop's objective is to consolidate innovative pedagogies and digital tools used across partner universities. The leading question of this moment will be "What innovative, collaborative and culture-sensitive formats of teaching can be piloted in the Alliance and support its development? ».

In relation to this question, one possible outcome of the workshop could be (to start generating) a toolbox that would help every institution/teaching person to put in place collaborative innovative formats of teaching in the Alliance. This toolbox could be a collection of bestpractice examples and also common guidelines on how to put in place such formats, etc.

This involves examining current study programs to establish collaborative educational offerings. If they can, the participant might bring some examples of current study programms, detailing the research status, implementation, potential development, and challenges of these teaching elements and tools.

The results will be summarized, offering an overview of innovative pedagogical strategies, tools, and their implementation status the status of innovative pedagogies and tools, along with future prospects for exchange beyond the project's conclusion.

Guidelines and a framework for BAUHAUS4EU joint European curricula will be developed to categorize and gather best-practice examples.

WEIMAR

Population: 65 000 | 12 UNESCO World Heritage Sites | over 30 museums

Weimar is a city located in Thuringia in Central Germany. No other German small town has so much German and European cultural history. During several historical eras Weimar was an important centre for artists, musicians, politicians, and philosophers. In the 18th century the city was home of the leading literary figures of the Weimar Classicism, such as Johann Wolfgang von Goethe and Friedrich Schiller. Composers such as Franz Liszt and Richard Strauss and philosophers like Friedrich Nietzsche made Weimar a musical and philosophical centre in the 19th century. Later, artists, and architects such as Henry van de Velde, Wassily Kandinsky, Paul Klee, Lyonel Feininger, and Walter Gropius came to the city and founded the Bauhaus design school. After the First World War, the first democratic constitution of Germany was signed here, giving its name to the Weimar Republic (1918-33). During Nazi Germany, the Buchenwald concentration camp was built just 8 kilometres away from the city centre. Today, Weimar is home to more than 30 museums, two universities and visited by ten thousand visitors each year.



Herzogin Anna Amalia Bibliothek

The Herzogin Anna Amalia Bibliothek was one of the first publicly accessible ducal libraries in Germany. After a disastrous fire in 2004, the rococo hall is fully renovated.



Bauhaus-Museum Weimar

The Bauhaus-Museum Weimar, inaugurated 2019, showcases the treasures of the world's oldest Bauhaus collection. The museum highlights the early phase of the most influential school of art and design of the 20th century.





Goethe Residence & Goethe National Museum

Goethe lived and worked at his home in Weimar for almost 50 years. In rooms designed by Goethe himself to reflect the classical ideals of his time, the residence became a centre for social, cultural, and intellectual dialogue.

Haus der Weimarer Republik

The Haus der Weimarer Republik invites visitors to learn more about the Weimar Republic period. It illustrates the crises and challenges the young democracy struggled with.





Before he passed away in 1805, Friedrich Schiller spent his last three years at this residence where he wrote his famous play "William Tell". Today, Schiller's original desk and bed are displayed.



Buchenwald Memorial

The Buchenwald concentration camp was established in 1937 and had over 280 000 prisoners which were forced to work for local armaments factories.
