

THE BAUHAUS - YESTERDAY AND TODAY

Weimar – European Capital of Culture of 1999 is renowned for its classical period with Goethe, Schiller, Wieland and Herder, birthplace of the Weimar Republic.

Weimar is also home to the most influential design college of the 20th century. Ninety years ago on 1 April 1919, Walter Gropius founded the »State Bauhaus« in Weimar with support from the provisional republican government of the Free State of Saxony-Weimar-Eisenach. Based on the principles of the medieval mason's guild (Bauhütten), the Bauhaus sought a new approach to uniting all disciplines of art and design. It reformed art pedagogy by removing it from the conventional academic environment, pursued a new approach to teaching the basics of art and design, and especially favoured the studio workshop for training students in the crafts and later industrial design.

In 1996, the same year the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar received its present name, the UNESCO added the historic buildings of the Weimar Bauhaus to its list of World Heritage Sites. These sites include the group of buildings which originally belonged to the former School of Fine Arts (now the main building of the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar), the former School of Arts and Crafts (Van-de-Velde Building) and the Haus am Horn, which was the first building ever to be constructed in the Bauhaus architectural style. The Van-de-Velde Building with its murals by Oskar Schlemmer has inspired artists and designers for over fifteen years. In addition to providing space for special events, the Haus am Horn also serves as a venue for modern exhibitions and installations.


THE BAUHAUS-UNIVERSITÄT WEIMAR

THE 2009 COMMEMORATIVE YEAR EVENTS AND UNIVERSITY PROJECTS

In 2009 the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar will reflect on the ideas of the classical Bauhaus in a number of modern projects and educational forms. These projects combine the illustrious legacy of the Bauhaus with the university's current activities. They focus on the original Bauhaus sites, their adaptation today for educational purposes, current university research and art and design praxis.

We wish to present who we are and what we strive to become – a Bauhaus of the 21st century, a Bauhaus of the »Digital Age«, a Bauhaus with partners around the world. The 2009 commemorative year will begin with a ceremony at the Deutsches Nationaltheater Weimar on 1 April 2009, marking the 90th anniversary of the founding of the Bauhaus. This event will also commence the 11th International Bauhaus Colloquium, the »Bauhaus Festival Weeks« and numerous other commemorative events at the Bauhaus-Universität that will take place throughout 2009.

A variety of formats, such as experimental architecture, web TV and the many presentation venues, will provide ideal settings for the activities. A line-up of numerous exhibitions will highlight the university's current scientific projects and research developments. The venues of these exhibitions will be simultaneously accessible to viewers via the Internet, providing audiences on location and throughout the world with a dynamic, optimistic and international venue of exchange. Besides a media platform ("virtual stage") and an exhibition of experimental architecture ("real stage"), the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar will introduce a commemorative year logo, a corresponding corporate design and a joint communication and marketing strategy with its partners.

In addition to using the historic sites, a communicative exhibition venue is required to provide appropriate formats and spaces for these events. A challenge, which will be addressed by the Faculty of Architecture in their project, »futu.re.flection.bauhaus — Experimental Constructions«. This project will also serve as a platform for joint research on standards of building technology, material aesthetics and energy savings together with national and international research institutes and industrial partners.

In summer 2009 the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar will open its studios, lecture halls and laboratories to the public. The event »summæry 2009« will present the best projects of the past year by students and lecturers from all the faculties, as well as showcase the most remarkable works in recent years. The customary annual review will be expanded with special commemorative formats, making the extended »summæry 2009« a superlative in terms of content, space and duration. In autumn 2009 the Faculty of Art and Design will host a series of events, scientific projects and lectures, titled »Bauhaus - From the Lab to the Project«. The teaching at the Bauhaus - from the laboratory to project realisation – has a historic dimension which corresponds to the changing attitudes toward the environment and reality. In addition to examining the historic dialogue, a debate on the modern science of projects will be presented. The focus lies on the presentation of exemplary projects and the constant debate of teaching in project work. The »Scientific Autumn« will be accompanied by a number of major events, including the international conference on the future of cities, titled »Futu.re City – Futu.re Bauhaus«.

OVERVIEW OF THE 2009 BAUHAUS COMMEMORATIVE YEAR

The 2009 commemorative year is an opportunity for the Bauhaus-Universität Weimar to take stock of the vibrant situation of today's Bauhaus. The university wishes to present itself and its activities in a wide range of artistic, scientific and, of course, interdisciplinary formats.

The numerous commemorative year events are clustered around three main thematic areas. In spring 2009 the programme will focus on the historic Bauhaus with a number of projects that examine the ideas propagated by the »State Bauhaus«.
