"Above" by Bauhaus student Florian Meyer, which pays homage to Paul Klee, was invited to contribute to the Melbourne Film Festival. Selected films are shown as supports to the astronomical shows at the Planetarium of Wolfsburg, Germany; the "Wolfsburg 360" seminar even plays the entire "Full-Dome Festival Reel". The media dome of the University of Plymouth accommodated a fulldome meeting with committed video artists. The international dimension of the fulldome medium is underlined by symposiums and other events in Kiel, Denver and Perth.

None of the fulldome activists has any doubt that the young medium will progress. With which contents, at what kinds of venue and to what extent it will get established and succeed is less certain. One can be sure that many old and new enthusiasts will return to Jena for the 5th FullDome Festival on May 12th - 14th, 2011, in order to register the next interim state of development. At the 2011 Festival, a special program called "VisuaLiszt" will be run and an award of like name put out for works devoted to the visualization of compositions by Franz Liszt in the fulldome format.

Sponsored by the State of Thuringia on the occasion of the Franz Liszt Year 2011, the "VisuaLiszt Award" is an indication of the broad spectrum of topics for, and the scope of interest in, fulldome projection.

In its short history since 2007, the FullDome Festival at the Jena Zeiss Planetarium has established itself as a presentation stage and a field of experimentation. The preferences of the initiators may differ, but they all agree that fulldome expands the capabilities of 3D pictorial and cinematic presentation, that it can add new functions to the classical planetarium and win it new audiences, and that immersive 360° media are a subject that is worthwhile in many respects. Now that specifications and formats for fulldome productions are on the road to international standardization, issues of content become the focus of interest, beyond the ah and wow effects and craned necks known from amusement park rides. Questions such as: What subjects can be presented on the spherical dome better, more convincingly and stirringly than on a flat, rectangular screen? Where is the public and where are the venues at which










the young genre can develop and prove its worth? Where are the fundamentals of the art taught? How big is the market? Will the fulldome avant-garde continue to stay put in a niche, or will it turn out the next big thing in the entertainment industry?

The wealth of ideas and the variety of styles with which the planetarium dome can be filled meanwhile was demonstrated nowhere better than at the 4th FullDome Festival. The first three days were reserved to professional full-length feature films. The program included 26 productions of widely differing kinds, some of them world premières. Four producers took home a "FullDome Award of Excellence" (see box).

As in the years before, Friday was the day of students' short fulldome films of maximally 5 minutes length. A packed house saw 34 contributions, including many clever experiments. Among the authors there were quite a number of students of the Bauhaus University of Weimar again, besides Hessian universities associated to the Hessian Film and Media Academy (HfMA), the Media Dome of the Kiel University of Applied Sciences, and the ArtsLab of the University of Albuquerque, New Mexico. At the concluding FullDome Gala on Saturday, the organizers presented the best contributions of all categories and conferred on them the coveted FullDome Awards, donated by Carl Zeiss AG and decided upon by an international jury. Finally, it was up to the audience to choose by ballot the winner of the "Audi-

of 500 EUR, also donated by Carl Zeiss. It went to Florian Meyer of Weimar's Bauhaus University and his production "Above". The second lucky winner by the audience's choice was Alexander Schumann (also of the Bauhaus University) with his fulldome animation "Petty Tyrant". He received an amount of 200 EUR, which had been collected by the audience themselves in the course of the Festival.

Despite the extremely time- and cost-consuming and data-intensive production of a fulldome show, there is a growing circle of adherents who see the potential of this medium and its overlaps with cinema, 3D animation, science visualization, media art and edutainment. Development is hampered by the fact that there are few places at present where fulldome productions can be tested systematically ence Award" with its prize money and shown in public. In this respect,

too, Jena's Zeiss Planetarium with its commitment and support to the FullDome Festival is a notable exception.

The 1st FullDome Festival in 2007 began with an almost informal presentation of student films. Following growth spurts in the years after, it was possible to broaden its base, so that participants meanwhile come from further universities and production companies from Germany and abroad. The works by creative young talents and those by professional producers are not far apart. For both groups, the 5th FullDome Festival 2011 promises to be another welcome opportunity of mutual exchange and contact with an interested public.
