What should be presented?



Prototype Presentation



- App name.
- Kind of service/type is offered by it.
- Target Group (tourists, students, elderly people, etc)
- Why it is needed? (Try to "sell" it)
- The OS (iOS, Android, etc) and why it was chosen.
- Screen Resolution.
- Screens presentation and navigation.

Prototype Presentation



In additional it can be presented:

- Some features are already in other apps, you can also show a comparison with them. For instance, in which way your solution is "better", or "easier" to access.
- You can also try to offer a totally "original" feature, that could be the real differential about your app from others.

The student should provide the entire mock-up for accessing a functionality.

For instance, if the user wants to select a feature from the welcome screen, which steps (and how many "buttons" should be pressed) until achieve the desired information.




Prototype Presentation: Time




For the presentation each student will have 15 to 20 minutes

How to cite

- In some countries all the academic material should follow the same reference style guidelines.

Helps to indentify the sources used in an academic work.





Writting Tips



- Abstract
- Introduction
- Discussion
- Conclusion
- References
- Appendix

Abstract

• What the paper is about - in a nutshel Example: "This paper is about the design aspects applied to the XYZ App Game, for engaging the users to collaborate to the game content (...)"

Introduction

 What is the problem/question that needed to be solved, and how the developed content is divided in the essay

Example: "The ever-expanding use of smart phones gaming industry can be explored for educational purposes, but making the player to collaborate to its content is still a challenge. The XYZ App Game was designed to make the user to collaborate without knowing it. For this task the trend design features were applied in its development (...). On section 2 it is described (...)"

Discussion

- How the problem/question was solved
 - Here it can be discussed:
 - what are the "state-of-art" (other similar projects) and what is the difference between the current research
 - what methods were applied;
 - why specifics design approachs were chosen; for instance: design considerations for small screens.

Conclusion

• What are the found solutions and conclusions; possible future improvements Example: "Planning a good interface design for mobile screen is not just a matter of providing colorful buttons and fancy graphics. For the XYP App Game the chosen features were aimed for a better user experience, (...)"

Avoid Contractions

Use formal negative forms



The analysis didn't yield any new results.



The analysis yielded no new results.

Limit the use of "run-on" expressions

These semiconductors can be used in robots, CD players, etc.

These semiconductors can be used in robots, CD players and other electronic devices.

Avoid "you" and "your"



You can see the results in Table 1.



The results can be seen in Table 1.

Rhetorical questions (okay in moderation)



What can be done to lower costs?

It is necessary to consider how costs may be lowered.

• Mid position adverbs?

This model was developed by Krugman (1979) originally.

This model was originally developed by Krugman (1979).

Split infinitives?

To rise sharply vs. to sharply rise

We need to adequately meet the needs of those enrolled in the program.

Efficient use of words

It may be difficult to make a decision about the method that we should choose.



Choosing the proper method may be difficult.

 Avoid "I", "me", and "my" (except in narrative writing)

I think that something should be done about the environment.

Something should be done about the environment.

Avoid direct address (except in process writing)

Think about the hardships of war. For instance, food is very scarce.

War comes with many hardships. For instance, food is very scarce.

Watch diction



The library has many resources available for its patrons.

Avoid slang



Avoid clichés



The customs that we practice are tried and true.

Beware of gender-specific language

If a student needs advice, *he* should contact the Careers Office.

Avoid Strong Statements (with no proof)



Nowadays everybody is using smartphones.

It can be seen that the use of smartphones are increasing.

Avoid Contractions

Export figures won't improve until the economy is stronger.

Export figures will not improve until the economy is stronger.

Use referents to keep your reader on track

This/these + noun

Lecturers know that students need to understand the differences between formal and informal language. However, this understanding cannot usually be acquired quickly.

- Use punctuation correctly
- Use sentence connectors (linking words and phrases) to help guide your reader.
