



Original	Proposal	Comments

The status bar and bottom bar are the same.</p> <p>The proposed 'Limes erleben' icon is a white Roman helmet on a dark background with a watchtower.</p>	<p>Most of the icons on the Limeswelten Mobil App do not have a reference to first of all the story of the Limes and secondly the purpose for which the icon stands for.</p> <p>I chose the <b>Limes erleben</b> icon which focuses on experiencing or discovering the wall structures built by the romans. Typically a discover icon with a binocular, compass or backpack might do, but I chose the helmet which was worn by most roman soldiers which is even featured on the app website. I think such a helmet gives users that notion of wearing such a roman helmet and going on the virtual experience offered by the App.</p> <p>The App uses a star which has no reference to its contents.</p> <p>The Favouriten icon which I did not work on could also be replaced with a treasure chest as the Romans were known to conquer and take over treasure when found.</p> <p>The icon was downloaded from <a href="http://flaticons.com">flaticons.com</a></p>
