


# Impact of Mobile Apps in Tourism Enterprise

- Almost 60% of users have at one point used an app for planning holidays




# Croatia as a holiday destination!



Picturesque gem that rose from a tiny islet settled meters away from mainland on one side and island of Ciovo on the other. With more than 2,300 years of history the city of Trogir is a unique representation of copious Greek, Roman and Venetian influences that contributed to its beautiful architecture and heritage.

Countless palaces, churches, towers and fortresses built from stone scribbled on a small island earning it its nickname – the stone beauty. No wonder it has been under UNESCO protection for almost 20 years. Abundance of cultural inheritance surpasses its spatial limitations.


